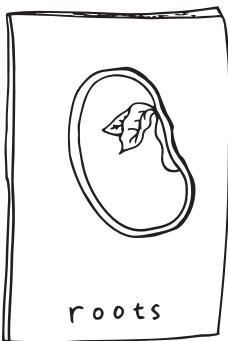
POETRY MEANT TO BE SAVORED

Each poem is an invitation for connection: a love letter yearning & offering a sense of place, agency, and healing

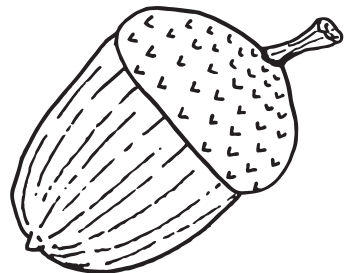


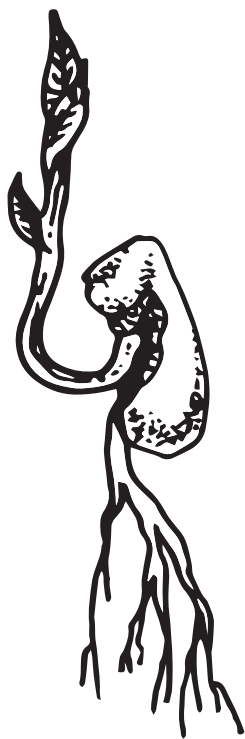
Artist Statement:
